## From the Pastor...

The COVID-19/Coronavirus is in the news and on our minds. As experts have said, we don't need to panic, but we do need to prepare. At First Baptist Church, your health and safety is paramount. Therefore we are instituting steps recommended by the CDC to help keep us all safe.

Here are few of the things we are doing:

- Frequently disinfecting doorknobs and other often touched surface areas
- Providing tissues and hand sanitizers
  - Hand sanitizer stations are on the walls throughout the building
  - Additional hand sanitizer is at entrances to Sanctuary & Fellowship Hall
  - Tissues are at the entrances to Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall
- Encouraging fist or elbow bumps instead of handshakes
- Encouraging members to stay home and watch via live stream if you are ill

Here are a few things you can do to help:

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
- Cover your cough or sneeze with tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash
  - Do not reuse tissues or handkerchiefs
- If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow - NOT YOUR HAND
- Stay home and watch via live stream if you are not feeling well
- Visit [CDC.gov](https://www.cdc.gov) for the most accurate and up to date information

For now we are not canceling any events or worship times, but we are monitoring the spread of the disease and will take appropriate actions if and when necessary. If we do have to cancel anything, we will let you know via Facebook, email, phone tree and TV. If you are not currently getting these, please make sure we have your correct contact information.

Having said all of this, I'd like to share with you some thoughts I consider just as important. During times of crisis, the church has a unique opportunity to be the caring presence of God. Much of Jesus' ministry involved healing the sick and he specifically encouraged his followers to help those who are ill (Matthew 25:36).

The church has been at its best when it looked beyond health crises to focus on the physical and spiritual health of those in need. From religious orders that care for the sick and dying to modern hospitals formed by various denominations; Christians have responded in faith to show Christ's compassion. Let's take every precaution to be safe, but let's also be the church.

## How to Pray During Difficult Times

- 1. Pray that God will be honored and glorified, whatever your circumstance, even if you have to suffer or go through a difficult time:** "...and call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you will honor me" (Psalm 50:15). "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that your faith – of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire – may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed" (1 Peter 1:6-7).
- 2. Love and pray for people who cause harm or suffering to you, or to others:** "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you'" (Matthew 5:43-44).
- 3. Pray for God to show you what He needs you to learn in the midst of difficult times:** "He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way" (Psalm 25:9).
- 4. Give thanks to God in the midst of whatever you are walking through:** "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). **Important note:** He does not say to give thanks *for* your circumstances, but to give thanks *in the midst* of them! (Ginny's note: Eph. 5:20 says "give thanks for everything".)
- 5. Pray that God will help you to be faithful instead of fearful when trials come:** "Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him" (James 1:12).
- 6. Pray that God will help you to be a light in the darkness to those who don't yet know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior:** "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). When people see the way you walk through difficulty, they will want to know where you draw your strength from!
- 7. Give thanks to God because He has overcome the trials and troubles of the world:** "These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

I believe that S. will grow out of his toddler phase, and my prayer for him is that he understands that he is loved. He is loved by his community and he is loved by God.

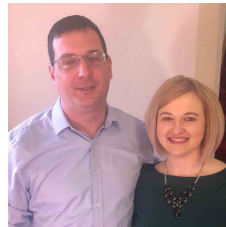
