

# From the Pastor...



I'm excited that we will soon start back our Wednesday evening programs. Our staff and lay leaders have been busy improving our activities. In fact, we have totally revamped how we will do things and think you will find our new Wednesdays to be both enjoyable and meaningful. The new schedule begins Wednesday, September 5, 2018. Over the summer we have worked to enhance three key areas: meals, children's ministries and discipleship opportunities.

#### Improved Meals

After speaking to a number of our members, we have come up with a new system to make our Wednesday Fellowship Meals better. First, our cooks have identified our most popular menus and will focus on serving those items we all enjoy. Second, we've developed a team of volunteers who will set up before the meals, provide a warm welcome and serve you a generous

portion. Third, we are expanding our serving time to go from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. This will enable our working folks to enjoy their meal when they are able to get here. Cost for the meal will remain the same: \$6.00 adults, \$5.00 children and a maximum of \$22.00 per family.

#### **Exciting New Children's Ministry – Wonderful Wednesdays**

Wonderful Wednesdays is the name of our new Wednesday after-school and evening ministry. Volunteers will be picking up children from several local elementary schools and bringing them straight to First Baptist Church. Once they get here they will enjoy several fun activities including: snacks, homework time, recreation and missions. The kids will then join their families for dinner followed by children's choir. So when our evening ends at 7:00 p.m., parents will pick up kids who have been fed, done their homework, exercised, learned new songs, experienced missions and grown in their faith!

If you would like for your child, grandchild, or any of their friends to be part of Wonderful Wednesdays, please contact Melissa Wilson to enroll them. If you would like to join the team of volunteers, there are opportunities for drivers, snack providers, homework helpers, recreation leaders, mission teachers and music assistants. Volunteers are being asked to give one Wednesday a month. As always, our children's volunteers must have a background check before working with children, so please volunteer quickly.

#### **Multiple Discipleship Opportunities**

This fall we will offer three Wednesday discipleship opportunities designed to enrich your spiritual and family life. These will begin at 6:00 p.m. and you are welcome to choose whichever best fits your needs.

First, Larry Gregg and Nelson Granade will be teaching a class entitled, *Footsteps of Jesus*. Since not everyone will be able to travel to the Holy Land in January, Larry and Nelson will provide a "virtual" Holy Land trip that highlights key events in scripture and the places where they occurred. This class will help you better understand scripture by providing you with strong background in the geography, terrain and culture of the land of the Bible.

Second, William Barnard will be teaching Jesus on Leadership. This class will explore the servant leadership model of Jesus. It will strengthen your faith and equip you to serve more effectively within our church and world. Whether you are interested in doing more in ministry or just want to learn more about how Jesus led, this is a great opportunity for you.

Third, Jason and Kim Allen, along with David and Nancy Deal, will lead *Christian Active Parenting*. This is an interactive parenting class that combines the wisdom of scripture with the time-tested Active Parenting approach. The videos by Dr. Michael Popkin will teach non-violent discipline guided by God's love, building trust between you and your child, smart ways to encourage school success and how to stop scolding and start smiling with your kids (www.activeparenting.com).

As you can see, Wednesdays at First Baptist Church are going to be really exciting this fall. All we need is you!

#### **Pew Cushion & Prayer Room Updates**

Our pew cushions are on order and our prayer room is open. Now we need to underwrite these two projects. So far our folks have donated \$12,370 toward the total cost of \$18,116 for the pew cushions. That means we need to raise another \$5,746 to fund the pew cushions. Similarly, our folks have donated \$1,337 toward the \$2,900 we spent equipping the prayer room. So we need to raise another \$1,563 to cover the prayer room expenditures.

Thank you for your generosity so far. We are almost ¾ of the way to paying for the pew cushions and almost ½ way toward coving the prayer room cost. With your continued support we should be able to quickly fund them both. Some have wanted to fund one or more pews and have asked the cost per pew. It is about \$350 per pew cushion.

# **Pray with Expectation**

Leonard Ravenhill said, "The two prerequisites to successful Christian living are vision and passion, both of which are born in and maintained by prayer. The ministry of preaching is opened to few; the ministry of prayer—the highest ministry of all human offices—is open to all." Think of it: the call to prayer is issued to ALL. And when we pray our approach to the Father is crucial. We should all pray in the way the Holy Spirit directs us. Some pray with spontaneous words, some with carefully thought out written words. Some kneel, some stand, some sit when praying. Some pray out loud, while others are more comfortable praying silently. I have observed that most pray with eyes closed, while some keep their eyes opened. I'm so glad I can pray in the way I choose, and I believe our loving God gives that same privilege to all who desire to talk with Him.

Though we may all pray in the different ways listed above, I believe there is one common factor that should permeate all of our prayers: expectation. How many of us can remember asking our earthly father for something if we didn't expect an answer? It's the same with our Heavenly Father, only greater! I believe it delights God when we bring our burdens, joys, sorrows to Him, not just with an attitude of "Maybe He will, maybe He won't", but actually looking forward to watching Him work on our behalf or the behalf of another for whom we are praying. Could it be that we might "see" more answers to our prayers if we approached God with expectation and waited with expectation for His answer? Remember, "[God] is able to do exceedingly, abundantly above all that we can ask or imagine".

#### Bite 95: Training witnesses of God's love

"We were recently asked to train 100+ Ukrainian Christian school teachers. When asked about the most important problem in their classrooms, the common answers were discipline and authority. The Ukrainian educational system still uses the old Soviet system. It does not value students, practices shaming and expects authority. During the training I explained that authority delivers short-term results, but influence goes farther. We used Jesus' example with the Samaritan woman to show Jesus' focus on building relationships that lead to transformation. At the end of our teaching, unexpectedly, we were thanked with a standing ovation and an outpouring of gifts. We are thankful that through CBF we are able to fulfill our call to teach and train others to be witnesses of God's acceptance, redeeming love and abundant life."

#### Bite 96: Giving grace and showing love

"I'm working toward proficiency in teaching in Slovak. As the girls arrived one Saturday morning for discipleship group, they asked where my daughters were. They care about my girls, but I knew they were wondering who would translate for me. I typically teach games and activities on my own, but this was the first week I brought the Bible Study without translation. God's message of grace and love is important, and I didn't want to get it wrong! As I taught, though, I learned more about God's grace and love myself. The girls listened and responded with insight. They gave grace and showed love. My words were not perfect, and sometimes someone had to translate my broken Slovak for the rest of the group. But on that day grace and love were shown by all, and we learned a little better what it is to cultivate beloved community."
