

# From the Pastor...

Most people want their church to grow, but how do you help that happen? Churches spend a lot of time and energy trying to attract people. We focus on offering quality ministries and meaningful worship hoping folks will find us and connect with us.

A Pew Research Poll revealed the top reasons people to come to church are: 1) To become closer to God, 2) So children will have a moral foundation, 3) To make themselves a better person and 4) For comfort in times of trouble/sorrow (Pew Research Center, Aug. 1, 2018, "Why Americans Go (and Don't Go) to Religious Services).

When we did our *Growing Young* emphasis, we were reminded that young people are attracted to churches that: 1) give them a place to serve, 2) empathize with their lives, 3) take Jesus' message seriously, 4) offer real community, and 5) serve their neighbors.

We who come to First Baptist Church know that it is a place you can experience God, grow in your faith and find community. We've worked hard to make sure we are focusing on our mission to know and love Jesus Christ and to make him known.

All this is good, but it doesn't help us grow, unless we share it with our community. There are a lot of things we can do to help connect folks once they visit our church. There is one thing that works best to get someone to our church the first time – a personal invitation!

The vast majority of folks who visit a church do so simply because they were invited. Advertising can get our name out. Working in the community can produce goodwill. Having effective ministries and meaningful worship can help people engage. Getting folks here to begin with takes you inviting them.

One good way to invite someone to First Baptist Church is ask them to a special event. First Fellowship is just such an event. We have designed this to be relaxed time of fellowship that will be a less intimidating way to introduce your friends to First Baptist Church. We'll simply enjoy some food and games on our front lawn.

For First Fellowship to be a success, we need you to both show up and bring someone with you. If you don't know who to bring, pray about it and let God reveal that person. Do you know someone who is lonely? Do you know of someone new to town? Do you know someone who is searching for meaning in life? If so, invite them to First Fellowship!
