## From the Pastor..



There is a town in Walton County, Georgia named Between. It's on Highway 78 halfway between Atlanta and Athens. It's also halfway between Walton County's two largest towns – Loganville and Monroe. I've driven through Between many times and there's not much there. In fact, it only has about 300 residents. Its main claim to fame is literally being between.

I've often thought that if I were the mayor of Between, I'd put up a sign that read, "Life happens in Between." I don't know if it would help the town to grow, but at least it might make people think while passing through Between. Perhaps a few might even stop and ask, "What's going on here?"

Life truly happens in between. Not necessarily the town, but in our lives. We are usually between something. We're between our last birthday and our next. We are between the 4th of July and Labor Day. We are between one major work project and the next. Even at church, we spend most of our time in between major events

Before writing my article for *The Interim*, I look at our events calendar to see what needs promoting. As I looked this week, I realized that there is no major event to promote. Camps are over and Vacation Bible School isn't quite here. As a church we are between things. Yet, it is in between that the work happens. In between is where we do our planning. In between is where we do our day to day work. In between is where things happen that make our major events work.

The experience was wonderful, but we would have to live our lives between. As I've matured, I've come to realize that it's in between where true life happens. Highs and lows come and go, but our day to day life shapes us so much more. Think about it, aren't your closest friends the ones who are with you day in and day out? Don't you find comfort in routine?

I do believe that life happens in between, because God is present in each and every moment of our lives. We only need to pay attention to the sacredness of day to day life. Look around you, perhaps God is shaping you even amidst the ordinariness of life. We need to pay more attention in between, because that's truly where we spend most of our lives. I'm trying to do so and invite you to do the same. Perhaps I'll even stop and look around, next time I'm in Between.

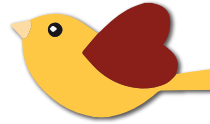
### Sunday, July 15, 2018

### New Pew Cushions

If you would like to help with the purchase of the new pew cushions, a designated fund has been set up to receive your gifts.

The task force has met and actually taken a wheel chair throughout the sanctuary to ascertain accessibility and best seating options. They too will be reporting back to the deacons on July 22, 2018 and on to the church at noon on July 25, 2018. Cost for this project should be minimal and can be covered within our existing budget.
