His Story

No matter how hard one may try, he cannot erase history. History is not ours to erase. History is His Story. "The Lord has established His throne in heaven, and His kingdom rules over all." (Psalm 103:19) One story that speaks of prayer comes from General George Patton, commander of America's Third Army, during WWII's Battle of the Bulge. It was said of Patton that he could be "unforgiving and stubborn at one moment, and easily commune with the Divine in the next".

The battle strategy was arranged with the allies, but the weather wouldn't co-operate. Rain kept drizzling day after day and fog was heavy. Patton commissioned his chaplain to write a prayer asking for clear weather and print it on a Christmas card with his signature to be sent to every soldier in the Third Army. The weather cleared for a critical period from December 20 to the end of the year. God was writing His Story!

"Before the end of the war, Patton personally wrote one final prayer that reinforced his image as a hardened but spiritual soldier:

"God of our Fathers...strengthen my soul so that the weakening instinct of self-preservation, which besets us all in battle, shall not blind me to my duty to my own manhood, to the glory of my calling, and to my responsibility to my fellow soldiers...Let me not mourn for the men who have died fighting, but rather let me be glad that such heroes have lived...Give us victory, Lord."

From King David to General Patton, before and after, and in between—God is writing His Story.

COVID-19 Update

As you probably have heard on the news, the CDC has changed the guidance on face masks. Currently masks are recommended for non-vaccinated individuals and for vaccinated individuals in areas with substantial (orange level) or high transmission (red level).

As I'm writing this, Iredell is a moderate (yellow) area, so only people who haven't been vaccinated are urged to wear face masks. However, you also need to know that cases are on the rise and 80% of cases in our area are the more aggressive Delta Variant.

Nurses at the Iredell County Health Department have told us that they expect Iredell to be in the orange or red zone soon. Our positivity rates have doubled in the last week and they expect this trend to continue until more people are vaccinated.

We will continue to monitor this situation and follow the advice of the Health Department and our Health Advisory Team. Please feel free to wear masks as you see fit until we have more direction. Remember, our Lord taught us not to think about ourselves, but rather how we show love and care for one another.
