The things we did at Operation Inasmuch, we can do every day. Yet, there is something special about working together as one big team. On days like this, we find our unity in our shared mission.

I'm delighted to be pastor of a congregation that knows how to "do" church, not just "come to" church. Church may not technically be a verb, but faith certainly is. You don't just have faith. You live out faith. True faith is about action. When we stop worrying about church and start being the church, God will bless us greatly.

My mother's favorite scripture verse was Micah 6:8 – "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" As I think about Mother's Day, I know my mom would also be proud that I pastor a congregation that knows church is a verb!

Help Our Miami Mission Team



In July a team from FBC will be heading to Miami for our 2017 mission trip. We will be serving at an organization called *Touching Miami with Love* or TML. TML was founded in 1995 to minister to the children and teens in Miami-Dade County. They have two separate locations - one in Overtown and one in West Homestead. Each of these communities have their own unique history and struggles, but generational poverty is a common theme.

Our team will be serving at the Overtown site. *Touching Miami with Love* is changing these communities by ministering to the children, teens, and families surrounding them. TML provides after school enrichment for the children and teens they serve. Their after-school program consists of feeding the children, providing homework help, bible studies, and other enrichment opportunities to help the children reach their full potential and break the grasp of generational poverty.

In February, Carla Wimpy and I attended an orientation meeting at TML. As we toured the area we were taken aback by the number of homeless people we saw under just one overpass. The conditions of many of the apartments we drove past were depressing, and the poverty of this community was obvious. After the tour we returned to TML just as the children were getting out of school. We saw bright smiles on their faces as they were eager to show their report cards to the staff at TML. The children were met with hugs, high fives and excitement as they celebrated the growth of each child. TML is focused on changing this community by empowering and equipping the children and teens.

In July our Miami Team will head to Overtown to spend a week working alongside the TML staff leading their summer camp program. Each summer they run a summer camp program that can best be described as a full day VBS! The kids will have times of worship, bible study, crafts, recreation, and other fun activities. They will also have time to focus on reading, computer skills, and social skills. We are excited to partner with TML and lead a week of their summer camp. We look forward to building relationships with the children, sharing with them about Christ, and learning more about their community and how we can make an impact.

We need your help! In previous years we have had yard sales, auctions, or talent shows to raise funds for our mission trips, and they have been very successful. Due to the damage from the fire, we do not have the facilities to host these fundraisers this year. Due to these circumstances, we are asking the congregation to participate in a special offering for the Miami Mission Trip. On Sunday, June 4, instead of the alms offering we will be collecting an offering for the Miami Mission Trip. It is our hope that this offering will be able to take the place of the fundraisers we have done in the past. We are asking you to partner with our team and give generously to this offering so that we can help make a difference at TML. Bite 31: Feeling Fears for Friend and Neighbor

"I was asked to translate for Latino parents when in tears they asked their pastor to consider becoming a temporary foster parent for their children should they be deported.

I cannot imagine facing the possibility of being separated from my children for weeks or months, even knowing they were in good hands while we were apart, or the feeling that I might lose everything I worked for all because I might happen to be confronted by an immigration official who believed I was a security or public safety threat and decide to deport me. Can we feel those fears and say we are afraid as well for our immigrant/refugee/Muslim/all vulnerable friends and neighbors?"

Bite 32: The Ministry of Family Reconciliation

"Four years ago Mina met Oiga while leading a Life Skills Manual for Youth training. Each of the 4 days of training Oiga would stay afterwards for personal counseling. The husband was no longer attending church, there was no communication with their teenage daughter, and all were hurt by an abusive pastor. After attending two different trainings, Oiga could testify that the parenting skills she learned through the trainings were working. Now the family is faithfully and actively participating in our home Bible study group, and attend and serve in a local church. We praise God that he can use us in the ministry of reconciliation."
