## Law of the Lord is Compass for Life

I was recently hiking in the woods near our house with two of my grandchildren. I see these outings as opportunities to teach them about the outdoors and to be alert to both dangers and joyous discoveries. On this particular adventure I began to point out certain landmarks that could help them remember where they are. For example, near some knotty maple trees I pointed out a huge old stump. A little later I showed them a pile of rocks that remind me to turn right to return to the main trail. We talked about where the sun was, and since it was afternoon, that meant the direction was to the west. I pointed out that with the west to my left that meant I was facing north. I told them that paying attention to landmarks can help them find their way in the woods or in a mall parking lot. Will they remember all of that? Hopefully with some repetition over the years, they will remember at least some of it. Who knows when some tidbit of information may be valuable to them at some point in the future.

What I am leading up to is to ask you to consider, how do we plot our course in life? What are the landmarks and direction signs for the journey of life? Psalm 1 is one of my mother's favorite scriptures. It emphasizes the importance of delighting in the "law of the Lord" as our compass for life. But what is the law of the Lord?

By the first century the Jewish religious leaders had expanded the Ten Commandments to 613 laws that attempted to define and clarify all of life. Of those 613 laws, 248 of them were positive (Thou shall) and 365 of them were negative (Thou shall not). It is not surprising that

there was considerable debate over which laws were the most important.

A religious leader asked Jesus that very question (Matthew 22:34-40). Jesus' response was a combination of Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18, which says to love God with our whole being and love our neighbor as ourselves. There is the essence of how to find our way through the journey of life. On Sunday, October 26, the sermon will explore this passage and the practical application for our lives in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

Mark 1:21-39 is a passage that has intrigued and instructed me for many years. It is the captivating insight into a jam-packed 24-hour period in the life of Jesus. News of his authoritative teaching and his miraculous healing spread like wildfire. As the new day dawned, the crowds were again gathering for more of this superhero. But Jesus could not immediately be found. After searching for him for a time, Peter finally found him. Where was he? Mark explains in verse 35, "In the morning, while it was still dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed."

If Jesus, God's Son, needed to carve out time to be alone with the Father in prayer, how much more do we need to be seriously disciplined to cultivate a lifestyle of prayer! On Sunday morning, November 2, we will explore the implications that this passage has for our lives.

I encourage you to spend some time studying and reflecting on these passages in preparation for our worship time together.
