Businesses make a lot off of Halloween decorations, costumes and candy; and even more from Christmas. At Thanksgiving, however, they only sell a few decorations and more turkeys.

Thanksgiving isn't a money maker, but that's not the only reason it hasn't become overly commercialized. It's also hard to co-op Thanksgiving, because it's focused on gratitude. It's difficult to mix greed and gratefulness. For this I'm truly thankful.

Of course this Thanksgiving will be like none other. The COVID pandemic is limiting our ability to celebrate in our normal ways. We need to listen to the experts and do everything we can to keep one another safe. We might not get to see all those we love, but we can still be grateful for them.

Of all days, Thanksgiving isn't a time to mope. You and our entire congregation will be very high on my thankful list. ## A Thanksgiving Prayer



### CBF Mission Bite

#### Mission Bite 202: Securing Insecurities

*When we arrived in Spain over 7 years ago, Spain was slowly climbing its way out of a difficult economic crisis. It has only been in the last year or so that we have seen signs of economic growth. And then, COVID-19 hit. People have speculated that the economic fallout will be worse than the previous crisis. Lines are already growing at food banks as people are without work and without a way to provide for their families.*

*Working at the food bank of the Baptist church in Cerdanyola has been a regular part of our ministry since the beginning of our time in Spain. In addition to serving at the food bank, we have been able to provide financial support for the ministry.*

*Recently, while working at the food bank, the coordinator, Pedro, pulled us aside. "Thank you again," he said. "Thank you for your hands to help and thank you for the financial support. It means so much." He had already thanked us numerous times, but he felt the need to make sure we understood how truly grateful he was. I shared with him that we had received additional support from CBF partners and would be making another donation to the food bank. He thanked me again and shared the following.*

*The normal regulations stipulating who receives food have been lifted by the government. This means that people seeking aid do not have to provide the authorization papers and anyone can receive assistance. This enables the food bank to assist more people. That very morning, Pedro told me that he had seen a man digging through the trash to find metal to sell for money. This is a common practice among those without work. That morning, without the regulations and with additional support they had received, Pedro went over to the man to ask if he had food at home. When the man responded he did not, he was invited over to the food bank and an allotment was given to him. On the way back to the food bank, Pedro saw another family and asked them the same. They too came for help.*

*At the Cerdanyola food bank, we are seeing the loaves and fishes being multiplied and people receive a small glimpse of hope in the form of an allotment of food during a difficult time.*

*Challenge: Food insecurity is a struggle not just in Spain but also in the US. Get to know local ministries addressing food insecurity and ask about ways your church can help.*
