## Holy Week

All through history, civilizations have sought ways to commemorate important movements and events. Monuments are built and holidays are declared as ways to keep alive the memory and importance of events and people in the past. Unfortunately, there is a tendency for historical monuments to become mere decorations and commemorative holidays to become just holidays. We are a wiser people if we not only remember our history but also learn lessons from the past that guide us in the future.

The above is important to remember as we move toward Palm Sunday and Holy Week. There is a rich historical background to the day we call Palm Sunday. The week of Passover was approaching and, for the Jewish people, Passover commemorated the liberation of the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt. For many at that time, this holiday season was made even more significant by the fact that they were currently under the domination of the Roman Empire. How they longed for a new liberator!

There were those who believed that Jesus just might be that liberator. After all, in addition to a number of other miracles, he had recently raised Lazarus from the dead. Was that not a clear sign that he was God's anointed to lead a victorious rebellion over the Romans? And what a ripe time for Jesus to do something decisive that would declare his identity and intent. The city would be filled with enthusiastic visitors who had come to celebrate Passover. Their religious and nationalistic zeal would be at a peak. As Jesus rode into the city his actions stirred up another historical memory. About two

hundred years earlier Judas Maccabeus had led a victory parade into the city after a decisive defeat of the Syrian oppressors. The people were delighted to recall the past and identify Jesus as the next political liberator. They greeted his arrival in the same way they had greeted Judas Maccabeus two centuries earlier. They sang and waved palm branches and spread their coats on the road as a "red carpet" welcome.

What they failed to recognize was that in at least two significant ways Jesus was decisively different. First, he rode into the city on a donkey not a war stallion. When a king visited his people on a donkey it was a clear sign that he came in peace, not as a declaration of war. Second, Jesus' ministry called for a genuine turning toward God as the sovereign King of life, which would birth an inner conversion, which in turn would produce lives characterized by love for others. He had not come to lead a political insurrection but a spiritual transformation.

The crowd that cheered for Jesus that day could not imagine that in five brief days Jesus would be executed on a cruel cross. The hopes and dreams of the disciples were crushed by that tragic turn of events. But the whirlwind had just begun! On Sunday the darkest tragedy was transformed into the brightest of joys. Death was conquered by Resurrection! Despair was transformed into hope! The cross, a symbol of shame and defeat, was transformed into a symbol of glory and victory.

Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter are not just dates on the calendar. Palm branches are not just embellishments in a parade. Crosses are not just ornaments. They are graphic reminders that the historical events of the past have powerful meaning for the present and for eternity.

# A Letter From Jerry Campbell

For the past two years I have served as chairperson for the diaconate, chair of the interim team and again chair of the new deacon team. As you know a lot has happened in this time period. For me it has been a roller coaster as we descended into a congregational valley of loss, mistrust, and misunderstandings. We have worked our way through much of that with a renewed focus on God, on prayer, and a lot of hard work to bring back a focused renewal in leadership, in vision, and a focus on a loving worship and fellowship as a congregation.

I believe that we are a congregation working toward becoming God's church rather than my church or our church. We have a strong ministerial staff with Dr. Roger Gilbert, who is doing an excellent job as interim, James Martin and Melissa Wilson who are covering many more tasks than called for in their job description. Our secretarial and maintenance staff are in place and committed to their areas of work. We have deacons in place who are operating as servant leaders and seven teams who are meeting regularly to carry out their part of the vision we adopted last year.

Things are taking place. Positive changes are being made. The search team is working hard. A new team is doing an outstanding job of reaching out to shut-ins. A team is working on a plan to help new church members move into full fellowship. Several new teams are to begin work in just a few weeks. Some of you will be asked to use your gift to help out on one or more of the teams.

We still have things to do. We still need to work on our outreach. We still need to practice more focused corporate and individual prayer. We still need to focus more on getting to know each other and to learn more about loving each other.

We still need to work on our stewardship. Too many of us are still withholding our tithe until the new preacher comes. Too many of us are only giving through designated offerings. Too many of us are taking our offerings with us when we go out of town. I hope if you are one of these you will pray about it. If you are not tithing I ask that you pray about that. We are at the time of year when our offerings are lower and our expenses are up. Pray about that and how you might be able to help.

The last two years serving as chairperson have been a learning time for me. It has also been a somewhat difficult time and a lot of responsibility. Pat and I have both had health issues that are now requiring more of our time and energy. At the last deacon meeting I asked to step down as chairperson due to upcoming medical treatments for the next few months. Instead the deacon team asked me to remain as chair and asked Dr. Hersey Miller to serve as Acting Chairperson.

The focus of the deacon team will be the same, a lot of prayer, discussions of the adopted vision, how we can support the staff and teams, and more importantly how can we serve and lead God's Church in the direction He would have us go.

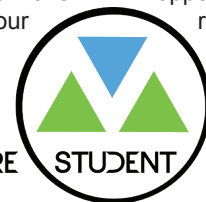
## FBC Preschool News

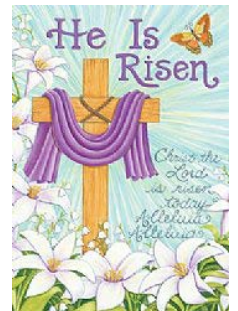
