Likewise, our personal lives and all dimensions of our church need to be bathed in prayer.

Each Wednesday night during the prayer time, your Deacon Chairman, Jerry Campbell, prays for the Pastor Search Committee and the person who will be called as your pastor. We don't know who that person is or when your committee will bring the recommendation. I join in encouraging all of us to be in prayer for the committee and the one who will be called. I am honored to be your interim during this process and look forward to our continued ministry together.

The Importance of Family Worship

During my time here at First Baptist, the children have stayed in the congregation for a full service only a handful of times. I believe strongly that children learn best in an environment where they can explore and ask questions. For this reason I take the children out of the service to go to Kids at Worship.

During Kids at Worship, we go a little deeper into what they learned in Sunday school, and I am able to make sure that they have a good understanding of the scriptures we are studying. Our other activities vary. We may sing songs, or pray through coloring a picture, or even consider how God sees us as his children. I firmly believe that this time of worship and learning is important for our children, but I also want our children to have a well-rounded experience of worship.

You can find churches where the children stay in the service the whole time, or spend the whole time in children's church and never worship with the adults. And there are decided benefits and compromises for every possible point along that spectrum.

of the larger congregation. They need to develop a love of worship. They need to learn what it looks like when someone joins the church. They need to see what happens in the service after the offering is collected. They need to see their parents open the scriptures and learn from the sermon.

It is a reality of our time that young people are leaving the church at an alarming rate. Some believe that part of the cause for this exodus is the decline in worshiping together as a family. I believe it is important not only to teach children in an environment where they learn best, but also to challenge them to learn in other environments as well. This teaches them that church is not about catering to the individual's whims or preferences, but about coming together to worship a Holy God.

I know it will be a big adjustment for everyone, myself included. Kids at Worship is my favorite part of the week! I also know that this small change is important in the development of our children This will be an adjustment for the whole church. The children will be learning how to participate in a full worship service. Parents will be adjusting to focusing on the sermon while helping their children to experience worship. It may mean that on those Sundays, there are a few more distractions, or a little bit more noise. You may see a parent need to take a child out of the service to settle them down or correct their behavior. Just remember as you are looking at that child that you are helping to teach them what it For the most part, I think we have a healthy balance where the children means to be a part of the body of Christ. News From The Deacon Ministry Team

Meetings of the Deacons of First Baptist have been more about prayer and discussion of how we can encourage the teams responsible for implementing the ongoing vision we adopted for our church than about simply doing business as usual. We feel our role is to guide the church as servant leaders rather than doing the business ourselves. When an issue or need is brought to our attention, we are involving church members who have an interest or knowledge in the problem to provide input.

This week two new teams will begin working and will report directly to the Deacons who if needed will bring reports to the congregation. The first will be a standing team who will deal with personnel matters and is comprised of Dr. Ken Wilson, Chairperson, Buzz Holshouser, Jeff Templeton and Nedra Van Zee.

A second temporary team will study how we receive new members. This team is composed of Chris Simon, Chair, Caroline Bentley, Phil Crowder and Libby Purcell. During our church wide studies it was found that many of our members do not know what we believe, do not understand that we operate under a set of bylaws, and many are involved only marginally in interacting with the other members of the congregation. This team is going to make recommendations for helping new prospects understand who we are, what we are about, and the various opportunities we have to help them become full-fledged members of the fellowship.

At our January meeting we also heard from representatives of the Pastor Search Team. While we did not get into specifics on candidates, we learned about their processes, focus and direction of the search. I personally was very encouraged and support their work fully.

I ask that you pray often for divine guidance for both the search team and the Deacons as we continue our work.
